Notice of Race (NoR)

Amendment 1: Removal of section 11. Penalty System (July 14, 2023 at 0820)

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

- 1 RULES
- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 [DP] RRS 40.1 applies and is amended so that it applies at all times while afloat.
- 1.3 The following national prescription may require advance preparation:
 - RRS 46 Person in Charge Sail Canada prescribes that the designated person in charge, if resident in Canada, shall be a member of Sail Canada through either a club affiliated to Sail Canada or such person's Provincial Sailing Association.
- 1.4 RRS Appendix T "Arbitration" will apply.
- 1.5 The Sail Canada Prescriptions can be found at https://sailing.ca/uploads/2020/10/Sail-Canada-Prescriptions-to-the-RRS 2021-2024.pdf
- 1.6 [DP] Protocols related to COVID-19 may be published at any time, state when they will take effect, and will state if they have the status of a rule.
- 1.7 The CORK code of conduct applies http://www.cork.org/wp-content/uploads/2021/06/CODE-OF-CONDUCT-v21.02.05.pdf
- 2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS
- 2.1 The sailing instructions will be posted on the online official notice board.
- 3 COMMUNICATION
- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at: https://www.racingrulesofsailing.org/documents/5196/event?name=j22-north-american-championship
- 3.2 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

- 3.3 On the water, the race committee intends to communicate with competitors on VHF radio. The VHF channel will be stated in the sailing instructions.
- 3.4 If any part of a boat's hull is on the course side of the starting line at her starting signal and she is identified, the race committee may attempt to hail her bow number. Failure to hail her bow number, failure of her to hear such a hail, or the order in which boats are hailed will not be grounds for a redress for request. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The regatta is open to boats of the J/22 class.
- 4.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online form and submitting it through the event website www.cork.org
- 4.3 All sailors must sign the waiver and release of liability form (Appendix 1)
- 4.4 To complete the entry process, participants must pay all fees and complete the attached checklist (Appendix 2)

5 FEES AND REFUNDS

Early Bird Fee: Completed entry process and entry fee received on or before March 30, 2023	CAD \$585 (13% tax included)
Regular Fee: Completed entry process and entry fee received after March 30, 2023, but on or before June 30, 2023	CAD \$650 (13% tax included)

- 5.1 The entry fee covers racing and site use including the use of the crane from July 12 16, 2023.
- 5.2 In the case of event cancellation or postponement by CORK, all fees except for bank charges will be refunded.
- 5.3 All fees except for bank charges will be refunded to boats that cancel prior to July 1, 2023.

6 [DP] ADVERTISING

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies.

- 7.1 The race committee may run one extra race on a day provided that they do not get more than one race ahead of the daily schedule and do not exceed the number of races scheduled for the event.
- 8 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION, MEASUREMENT, AND CREW WEIGHING
- 8.1 All boats will be required to have a valid measurement certificate registered with the IJ/22CA.
- 8.2 Boats with a valid measurement certificate will have the required portable equipment in accordance with IJ/22CA Section C.5 verified and the boat weighed in accordance with IF/22CR Section C.6 during registration hours.
- 8.3 Skippers and crews will be required to comply with IJ/22CR Rule C.2.2: total crew weight (C.2.1 (a)) and substitution (C.2.1 (b)). Competitors will be weighed during registration hours listed in NOR 7. Schedule.
- 8.4 A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with IJ/22CA Rules and the sailing instructions.
- 8.5 Sails shall be dropped off for measurement at the Portsmouth Olympic Harbour Sailroom during registration hours.
- 8.6 Only one suit of sails may be used for the entire regatta. The sails for a boat shall be measured and stamped by the regatta organizers.
- 8.7 In accordance with RRS Appendix G, a boat chartered or loaned for this event may carry national letters or a sail number in contravention of the Class Rules.
- 8.8 In the event of damage, boats and equipment may only be substituted with the permission of the race committee, except as in NOR 8.9 Equipment Substitution application is available on the online Official Notice Board.
- 8.9 If the damage occurs less than 2 hours before the first scheduled start on a racing day, and before the start of the last race of the day, provisional verbal permission shall be obtained from the race committee before using the equipment in a race and online equipment replacement permission shall be requested before the end of the protest time limit at the end of the day in which the substitution takes place.
- 9 VENUE
- 9.1 Sailing will be in Lake Ontario South of Portsmouth Olympic Harbour.
- 10 COURSES
- 10.1 The course to be sailed will be windward/leeward with a windward offset mark and a leeward gate.
- 11 PENALTY SYSTEM
- 11.1 RRS Appendix P, Special Procedures for RRS 42 will apply.
- 12 SCORING
- 12.1 One race is required to constitute a series.
- 12.2 When fewer than six races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 12.3 When from six to nine races have been completed, a boat's series score will be her total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 12.4 Nine races are scheduled.
- 13 [DP] BERTHING

- 13.1 Boats will be launched from Portsmouth Olympic Harbour and trailers will be stored in the designated storage areas with the boat's bow number as identification
- 13.2 Berthing will be assigned by the OA.
- 13.3 All boats shall be afloat by 1630 on July 13, 2023
- 13.4 Rudders shall remain affixed during the time afloat.

14 [DP]HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

14.1 Keelboats shall not be hauled out between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the event except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

15 [DP]DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

15.1 Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around boats between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the event.

16 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY AND RISK STATEMENT

RRS 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone." Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event.
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore.
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omission.
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate.
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organizers does not relieve them of their own responsibilities.
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.

17 INSURANCE

17.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000. The organizing authority does not accept any responsibility for verifying that a boat has valid third-party liability insurance.

18 PRIZES

- 18.1 The Canadian J/22 Class will provide a variety of prizes depending on the number of competitors in the fleet. Some class associations may provide their own additional prizes.
- 18.2 Other awards may be given.
