 - 2.2 We collaborate with partners such as Sail Canada, Ontario Sailing and other Provincial Sailing Assoc. (PSA) to build training opportunities
 - 2.3 We pursue activities to attract, train and retain volunteers

- 3. To improve CORK's, and-Canada's, regatta hosting capability (*Planning Group/ Finance Committee*)
 - 3.1 We search out and embrace new regatta management best practices and technology
 - 3.2 We strive to manage financial resources responsibly to enable quality regattas and the long-term sustainability of our event program.
 - 3.3 We engage with all levels of government to ensure CORK, and the site on which we operate, continue to be well capable of hosting major international events
 - 3.4 We engage with partners in the sailing community, the Kingston Community, sponsors, donors, and suppliers to improve CORK's regatta hosting capability
- 3.5 We feature activities to foster a feeling of social community and enthusiasm to be a participant in CORK
 - 3.6 We have a year-round, dynamic social media program
- 4. Pursue sociably responsible and proactive policies and procedures (Governance Committee)
 - 4.1 We strive to be diverse, equitable and inclusive and encourage those qualities
 - 4.2 We strive to be environmentally conscious and promote programs in support of that consciousness
